Ronald McDonald House[®] of Cleveland, Inc., a nonprofit organization, supports families whose children receive treatment at area medical centers by providing a home-like environment and essential resources and services. We serve thousands of families each year through our 55-family House, Family Rooms in four local hospitals, outpatient facility STAR Centers and family resource link www.redtreehouse.org.

Strauss has a personal reason for his involvement with the Ronald McDonald House. When he and wife Jeanette were expecting their first child, they traveled to Illinois to spend the holidays with Jeanette's family. While there, Jeanette went into premature

labor. Their son Morgan was born and immediately lifeflighted to St. Louis, where he remained in the NICU for the next three weeks.

Alone in an unfamiliar city while their child clung to life, Jeanette and Keith found comfort and support at the Ronald McDonald House. Jeanette recounts, "It was more than a warm bed and a hot shower at the end of a long day—we had a family through the caring volunteers, attentive staff and countless other families who could empathize with us...we imagine if we had gone back to a hotel room and it had been just the two of us." They stayed at the House until Morgan was stable enough to be lifeflighted home to Cleveland, where he spent another $2^{1\!\!/_2}$ months in the NICU.

The Strausses were deeply touched by their Ronald McDonald House experience, and became dedicated supporters of RMH in Cleveland. Since 2007, Keith and Jeanette have participated as Committee Members, event attendees, sponsors and goodwill ambassadors. Keith joined the RMH Board of Directors in 2011 and became Board President in December of 2017. Morgan had a normal childhood with two younger brothers and is now a grown man. Each year, the family sponsors a room at RMH in his name.

We remembered our rich 40-year history and honored our founders, while celebrating those who keep their legacy alive and thriving today. We revisited the House's transformation through the years and we continued to make significant organization-wide improvements. We are proud of where we began, where we are today and our accomplishments of the past year as we continue to provide crucial comfort and support to families who need us.

AT THE HOUSE

2019 saw a 7.5% increase in occupancy with the largest number of families in our history. We provided more fresh and nutritious meals than ever before through our revamped Family Meal Program. Key common areas were refurnished and the security systems were extensively upgraded.

AT THE HOSPITAL AND OUTPATIENT CENTERS

We celebrated milestones as the Family Room at Cleveland Clinic Fairview marked ten years of service and our outpatient facility STAR Centers completed their first full year of operations. Our respite rooms were used 941 times, providing critical overnight rest to caregivers of the most vulnerable patients.

ONLINE

RedTreehouse.org began reaching more audiences with new contracts in the areas of mental health, addiction services and trauma-informed care as well as a grant-funded geographic expansion into areas of Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

Just as families depend on RMH, we depend on our volunteers, donors, and corporate and community partners. In 2019, a record number of individuals and groups gave their time, merchandise, services and money to carry on our founders' mission of helping families. And as we looked back, we remembered the families we've helped, welcomed new arrivals each day and laid foundations for a future of serving more people in more ways than ever before.





Daily meals, spacious common areas, fully equipped kitchens and laundry facilities help guests feel at home. Beautifully landscaped grounds and a playground offer a welcoming retreat. But the thing guests appreciate most is the people. 2019 was no exception as our volunteers, donors and corporate and community partners contributed more than ever to make the House a place of comfort and support.

Kelly Carmack Mata and her son John stayed at the House for three months so he could go through intensive treatment for a condition that was causing him to be malnourished. In 2019, **1285** wish list drives provided **\$324,354.13** worth of food, supplies and other items.

HOME IMPROVEMENT

Erin's Journey

Angela Jordan's third child, Erin, was born with a heart defect that would require surgery within her first year. Initially strong enough to go home, the tiny infant soon started having blue spells and was admitted to the hospital, where she has been since early October 2019.

For local families, even a short distance can be too far away from their hospitalized child. Since arriving at the hospital, Erin has had two cardiac arrests and several open-heart procedures, her condition so fragile that her grandmother, Lori, has spent every night by her side. Angela splits her time between the hospital, working and caring for Erin's siblings Sammy and Jamie.

Their faith and the support of the Ronald McDonald Family Room have kept the family strong. "I can go to the Family Room and take a shower and get something to eat without leaving the area" says Lori, who takes Sammy and Jamie to the Room when they get restless. "We give them a break in the Family Room and don't feel like we have to leave the hospital. They love the room." Angela appreciates that she can have more time with Erin, knowing her other children are in a welcoming and supportive place.

Even with her difficulties, Erin's personality is emerging. She is expressive and quick to reach for objects or grasp a finger. Now more stable, she likes to be propped up and greet visitors with a smile and inquisitive eyes. Doctors are hoping she is soon strong enough for a complete heart repair. Until then, Lori, Angela and her siblings will remain by Erin's side, with a little help from the Ronald McDonald Family Room.


The STAR Centers at Cleveland Clinic Children's Outpatient Center and the UH Center for Women & Children both completed their first full year of operations, serving over 7,000 children.

The support of the Ronald McDonald House extends beyond walls through our online Family Resource Link. **RedTreehouse.org** supports the well-being of families and children with challenges, disabilities and health care needs by linking them to resources in their community. Site visitors can find organizations, tools, helpful guides and events to meet their needs.

RedTreehouse.org resources became available on the Ohio Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse's new youth-led online community site, HeyImHere.org.

A \$50,000 RMHC[®] Remarkable Impact Grant, funded by AbbVie, enabled RedTreehouse.org to expand into Pennsylvania and West

Through a contract with the Ohio Attorney General's office, RedTreehouse.org is serving as the online resource directory for the Linking Systems of Care for Ohio's Youth (LSCOY) project. The project goal is to improve the response to children and youth who are victims of violence and/or impacted by trauma. Ohio State Bar Foundation grant activities that began in 2017 came to a close. Local legal interns researched and published more than 40 helpful guides and added hundreds of resources to the site. Four live educational webinars were conducted and are available for viewing on the site.

Looking Forward

The original Ronald McDonald House of Cleveland had rooms for 26 families, some common spaces and a shared kitchen. In 1994, a new 36-family House was opened with beautiful grounds, more shared spaces and a kitchen that could accommodate meal groups and families who wished to cook. Expanded in 2013 to 55 rooms, the House helps more families than ever stay strong to focus on the most important thing—their children.

In 2019, RMH launched the 40th Anniversary Campaign for updates to serve families well into the future. The goal is to raise \$2.1 million for projects including:

New Kitchen

The kitchen is central to our community of love and support, and now serves 1085 meals per year, up from 436 when it was last upgraded.

Renovation plans include:

- Commercial equipment that is more efficient and can handle the number of meals provided
- Increased ability to comply with newer food safety requirements
- Increased space for larger groups who come to prepare family meals
- Upgraded family kitchens for those who want or need to cook their own meals
- Updated serving and seating areas, with more efficient traffic flow

Increased Laundry Capacity

The RMH laundry room is used by families and also for the countless loads of bed linens, towels and other items needed to keep the House running. Renovating the space and purchasing new, stackable units will double capacity while saving on utility costs and increasing convenience for our families.

Day Room

Renovation plans include converting current utility space into a Day Room for families who are not staying overnight at the Ronald McDonald House, but still need our support and a quiet place to get away from the hospital during the day.
